You can take a look at your situation from the following point of view:

Some theoretical background

1. LOVE = friendship (spirits) + sex (bodies)

As far as I understand, you have everything OK with the first part. But there is probably a lack of the second summand (passion, desire etc). So such relationship could have a trend to develop into a pure friendship.

In order to build up a successful relationship, one should develop friendship and sexual attraction in parallel. Once there is a disproportional growth of any of these components, then there can be a trouble:

- If you have great sex but do not feel you can talk for hours with that person, then one day either you find a way to talk for hours, or you both find another partners.
- If you have trustful relationship but no sex, then this is a direct road to friendship.
- 2. Another point is that women are more oriented for friendship and men are more oriented for sex.

Of course this is rough estimation, but overall this is true due to physiological reasons. So if she gets her destination point (which is friendship, close mental relationship, trust etc.) for no intimacy, then it makes no sense for her to develop the latter.

3. It does not matter what you are doing. What does matter is your internal state while you are doing this.

To give an example, a man invites a woman for a dinner. If he is not ready to accept a reject (his internal state) - he will fail. And vice versa, if he is doing this as a funny game, being ready to accept any decision, then any consequences will be actually his success! (new experience, fun, etc)

My personal point of view

From my personal judgement, your relationships are slowly turning from interest&passion into friendship. I'm sorry to tell this but you should have had sex that night Now the question is if/how it is possible to drive your relationship car from a curb back to a highway.

Again, the major risk is that she could see you as a friend and not as a love partner. Once again, I'm not saying that this is how she is definately perceiving you as a friend. But based on how you have described that situation, there is kind of a risk that this could take place.

Why do I suspect this?

Well, you have mentioned that you are talking for hours on the phone, and you were saying how much you missed her - this all seems to be fine after sex, but not before.

When this happens before, then relationships are turned into a friendship but not into a romance. Of couse there always can be exceptions to this rule, for example in case when you a perfect match one for each other in terms of interpersonal relationships. In this case it actually does not matter what to do and how much to talk on the phone, before or after sex, who is calling first etc, just because one day you will feel that you can't live without each other. But this is not always the case And sometimes we should add some analysis to the situation.

My recommendations - what to do

First of all, you should stop dreaming/missing/thinking too much about her until you have sex! You should change your internal state. Think about this like is just a game and this is not serious (even if it is).

Secondly, you should clarify her real attitude to you and then act depending on how far you from a highway.

You can invite her for another dinner or for any other event. But if she rejects, do not tease her about this. Girls are smart enough to understand that teasing is a hidden form of begging (!). So:

- If she agrees then make sure it will lead to sex as soon as possible. Then try to develop both sides of your relationship in harmony as I explained above.
- If she rejects, then you need to raise the stakes and internally you should be ready to loose her (or to leave it as a friendship which is the same). Sample steps:
- -- Take a step back, which means make a pause for a few days or even weeks.
- -- Next time when you talk to her, act as a lover and not as a friend.
- -- Acting as a lover does not mean to be rough. Instead, this means to:
- 1) Recongnize your sexual feelings by yourself and let them be. There is a male inside you, isn't he there?
- 2) Express and communicate your sexual feelings to her in a polite but streighforward way.
- 3) Respect yourself and respect her.

Its kind of difficult ot explain what exactly to do in details but I hope you got the overall message.

There is no "right" and "wrong" action in this situation.

My personal solution in such situations is: when any issue comes too difficult i.e. takes a lot of my my attention, I'm trying to lower the degree of my interest. To keep it as a good balance between "in" and "out". Just make sure you keep this game "lightweight"

Changing your goal also helps. Instead of trying to reach the goal "I should date her!", let your goal to be "Hm.. What would happen if I do this and this..?"

For example, you can show that you have moderate interest by replying "ok lets talk next week then", i.e. with no particular date. Then to see if/how she responds. Or you can suggest a particular date and then see what would happen. You can also do not reply at all. Or you can tell her those three words in response

What would you choose from "what would happen if..?" point of view?

But do not let the situation to control your mind and your attention. Keep it easy, thats all I suggest in such cases.

I understand that this might sound like giving in or loosing, but paradoxically this is the only way to win and not to give in

Imaging that you were thinking all the day and night about her, you have put a lot of efforts and you've done a lot of analysis and then implemented the best strategy and then finally you got her! Do you think this is the end? No, this is just the beginning You will be jealous, you will be scared to loose her, you will be unsure how to keep her etc. Because you are too much "in". 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Thank you for your answers. I believe now I have a recommendation for you. But first let me explain some background that my recommendation is based on.

Since you are aiming for a long-term relationship, I suggest to focus on mutual trust from the very beginning, even if at the moment it might not clear how it all will develop.

The theory.

Let me tell you a very important thing about relationship. This thing is: with absolutely no exceptions, any lie or "secrets that she should never know" destroy relationships. This rule works in 100% cases, sooner or later. It might sound over-complicated or even naive, but this idea has quite a simple explanation.

The fact is that the human mind works in a way that it is always tries to be consistent and to be "right". Basically this is how we survive. Every time I do something wrong to the other person, which means something that I would not like he/she does back to me under similar circumstances, my mind is trying to "justify" this act. This justification is done by finding a reason why that person deserves what I did to him. This is the road to become a "victim" in order create more and more such "reasons". Persistent critics is the first symptom of this situation. And this works in 100% cases, no exclusions. For your relationships this is similar to a stone inside a *. You will have to remove the * and to put it again but it will be a completely different relationship, often started from

the beginning. This is perfectly illustrated in "Mr. and Mrs. Smith" movie

So my strong belief is that the true long-term relationship can only be based on trust. And trust is defined here as a readiness to discuss any action that has been taken towards to the partner. I can give more examples or explain in some more details if needed.

Unfortunately this principle is often invalidated in our society, in some movies (other then the one I mentioned above), TV shows, books etc. They impose that "there is nothing wrong if she never knows". But the truth is that these "secrets" never work. Trust is what really works and what leads to happy and really long-term relationship.

Do you have any questions about this basic principle?

The practice.

Let now apply this approach to your situation. Since you are in official business relationship and since this had happened before your romantic relationship had a chance to begin, the situation should be clarified between you and this lady.

The reason is that there is a potential conflict between business and personal relationship. Let me explain with a few examples.

It might be that she was really interested in you as a dating partner, but when you started your business relationship, she could move the perception of you to be a client as opposed to a potential love partner.

Alternatively, it might be that she has made a conclusion that you have been only interesting in her as a realtor. Then she might gave up her romantic expectations ("..She didn't look all that happy at all on her face... I could feel the tension and feeling between us became more like friends..").

Another possibility is that she was not really interested in you as a dating partner from the very beginning. But then she decided to use some kind of flirting a little bit in order to keep you as a lead (you know, sales can be hard nowadays).

As you see because of this mix personal vs. business it seems to be difficult to understand what is going on for now. Even if you start to date her somehow and even if you merry her, sooner or later you will have to talk about the beginning of your relationship to clarify this. And I suggest to do this as soon as possible.

In other words, I suggest you bet on trustful long-term relationship (even if this may be harder), rather then on simple but short-term (which may be easier).

What I would recommend is to meet her and explicitly communicate that you are interested in her as a lady first of all, regardless of the success or failure of your future business cooperation. Of course, it is not necessarily to tell this that literally, since you should probably keep some kind of intrigue to warm-up her interest.

I believe you will find a way to communicate this firmly If not then please let me know and I will try to help you with that.

Right after this I suggest that you start to act as a male who is interested in a female, just like said "be more upfront and honest about my intention". Probably you should try to kiss her or something like that.

I also suggest that in the same you start to observe if/how her behavior changes. In this situation she will have to make a choice what is more important to her - romantic or business relationship with you.

Depending on this you may choose if you are still interested to develop romantic relationship, or just keep your biz. relationship or both (in the last case you will need to set a top priority which is obviously romantic relationship).

Regarding the other advice to keep it light and fun. From my point of view this way you will continue to be in an undefined situation and will just be loosing your time (life is too short!). I suggest you make it clear as soon as possible. In the worst case you will just be sure that you can put all you energy to find a new lady. And in the best case.. I guess you know
